NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, in accordance with section 114 of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 ("FSMA") that, on Thursday 17 December 2020, an Order was made by the High Court of Justice of England and Wales under sections 111 and 112 of FSMA sanctioning an insurance business transfer scheme (the "**Scheme**") providing for the transfer of the whole of the insurance business (comprising policies, assets and liabilities) of The United Kingdom Mutual Steam Ship Assurance Association (London) Limited ("**UKL**") to The United Kingdom Mutual Steam Ship Assurance Association (London) Limited ("**UKE**"). The transfer of the insurance business pursuant to the Scheme became effective at 12pm UK time on 30 December 2020.

The Order:

- (1) sanctions the Scheme pursuant to which the whole of the insurance business of UKL shall transfer to UKE; and
- (2) makes ancillary provisions in connection with the Scheme pursuant to section 112 of FSMA.

The holder of any policy included in the transfer for which the Scheme provides and which evidences a contract of direct insurance in respect of which an EEA state other than the United Kingdom (as such terms are defined for the purposes of FSMA) is the state in which the risk is situated may exercise its right to cancel the policy within 21 days of the date of publication of this notice or such other period as the law of the relevant state shall determine.

If any policyholder intends to cancel their policy as outlined above, they should contact UKL as soon as possible (contact details above).
