Bulletin 384 - 10/04 - Australian Immigration Authorities - New Legislation

From 1st July 2003, the Australian Immigration Authorities have enacted legislation that requires all personnel onboard non-military ships to have their civil passports. This legislation though it came in force in the year 2003 was not being enforced till 1st July 2004. The penalties stipulated are A\$5,000 per crew member without the appropriate documentation. An extract of the DIMIA requirements is as follows:

Any of the following combination of documents is acceptable:

- 1. A valid passport together with a valid seafarer's identity document.
- 2. A valid passport together with an identity card issued by the shipping company providing the card contained the relevant biodata, a company reference number that established the holders employment on the vessel for the voyage in question and stated the person's position on board the vessel.
- 3. A valid passport together with an original contract of employment providing that document contained the relevant biodata, a company reference number that established the holders employment on the vessel for the voyage in question and stated the person's position on board the vessel
